# Orthosis Lab: The Five Orthoses Every Acute Therapist Should Feel Comfortable Fabricating

## **Course Description**

This course will cover the most common orthoses encountered while working as an occupational therapist. The goal for this course is to cultivate interest, competence, and culture of comfort with orthotic application as an occupational therapist.

#### **Course Objectives:**

## At the conclusion of this course, participants will be able to:

- 1. Summarize how to interpret the orders properly as well as take down and redo dressings that are appropriate for the fabrication of the orthoses.
- 2. Demonstrate understanding of the varied materials and tools used in fabrication of UE orthotics
- 3. Understand common anatomical landmarks and how to account for them in the fabrication process and create void spaces for post-surgical pins, wounds, interactions with patients at bedside.
- 4. Practice and understand how to complete: resting hand, forearm based thumb spica, wrist cock up, ulnar/radial gutter, and forearm based dorsal blocking splints.

#### Presenters:

Rachel Shon, MOT, OTR/L graduated with her master's degree in occupational therapy from Cleveland State University in 2009. She has worked with Miami Valley Hospital since 2009. She has initially on the acute care Burn and Medical/Surgical ICU units and then transitioned exclusively into hand therapy approximal eight years ago.
